## **Beyond Knowledge**

Dear Friend,

Paul the apostle writes something incredible in 1 Corinthians 2:12-13.

1Co 2:12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.

1Co 2:13 Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

Is not my objective to teach the full extent of everything that is entailed in these two verses, but in short, Paul is telling us that because we have received the spirit which is from God (the bornagain spirit), we now have the capacity to be taught by the Holy Ghost. The Holy Spirit wants to teach us the things from God that have been freely given to us in regards to our inheritance in Christ.

Paul is saying in essence that we speak (or teach among ourselves) not in words from man's wisdom, but rather from what has been taught to us by the language in which the Holy Ghost teaches us – the language of praying in other tongues.

Understanding these verses helps us understand something that Paul wrote earlier in this chapter in verse six.

**1Co 2:6** Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought:

One of the things that I believe has been freely given to us by God in our inheritance, is the revelation of the End-Time Harvest, or Revival.

For illustration purposes, I would like to give a variation of the verses that we have just covered and say them like this:

"We who are on this Walk of the Spirit are speaking and teaching among ourselves the mystery of Revival which has been taught to us by the Holy Ghost through praying in other tongues."

Week to week, I am amazed when I listen to my fellow ministers as they teach. The teaching language that we are using to explain where God is taking us as a group in regards to Revival can only be taught to us by the Holy Spirit. It's almost as if we had compared sermon notes in preparation for our services, yet nothing could be further from the truth! The truth is that

someone other than ourselves is in charge. Someone else is directing us beyond our knowledge. It's kind of scary in a wonderful way! "Someone's out there?" Ha! Yes! The Holy Ghost!

Nevertheless, one of the things that I hear among the men and women who are contending for Revival is a cry for something beyond knowledge. The knowledge that has been taught to us by revelation from the Holy Spirit concerning Revival is graduating. The graduation of knowledge is the doing of knowledge. We are not taught by the Holy Spirit for the sake of knowledge alone, but for the purpose of the doing of the knowledge.

The doing of the knowledge of Revival is that the blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, etc. etc., and the masses are won to Christ.

We who are perfect (meaning spiritually mature) are speaking something among ourselves that we have never seen before. Up to this point in history, we who are perfect (spiritually mature) have, for the most part, taught a Gospel that has the power to perform all the miracles of Jesus on a consistent basis. We have been faithful teachers of that which we have been unable to perform in fullness.

To this point, we have been more familiar with seeing stage four cancer claim lives than seeing the lives we've been able to save through prayer. Our experience has been contrary to our doctrine, and that has been what is most familiar to us. BUT! We who are perfect (spiritually mature) will not settle for the familiar being the norm! Our normal is presently graduating to a place where it is more unusual not to see the hard cases totally healed. Our norm will be that the mysteries we have been speaking have turned into a living reality. What we know in knowledge is not enough anymore! Our hearts are yearning for the materializing of the knowledge!

**1Co 8:2** And if any man think that he knoweth any thing, he knoweth nothing yet as he ought to know.

**1Co 8:3** But if any man love God, the same is known of him.

The secret to the fulfillment of anything that we know in knowledge is to be "known of God." Anything that I think I know falls short of its fullness unless I am known of God.

Paul is giving us the most important key to the fulfillment of knowledge, and that is to be known of God. This means having a deep love and fellowship with Him in intimacy. God will become a friend and will enjoy coming in presence. God will lavish himself on that person to the extent that God Himself would testify and say, "I know this person."

There is not a teacher I know presently who is teaching the mystery of Revival who is not also sharing the absolute necessity for intimacy through private and corporate worship. The transition from the knowledge of Revival to the materializing of Revival is in God knowing you through time spent in His presence.

To say we are so close to the materializing of Revival would be an extreme understatement. My encouragement to you is to move in stronger than ever before. Do not just seek knowledge, press

past the knowledge into presence. Press past being able to say that you know God, and move upward where God knows you through a familiar place of time spent in His presence.

Candy and I want to thank you for your diligence in giving to this ministry. You have been faithful during a very difficult time. My prayer is that God's grace continues to bless you spirit, soul, and body, so that you will have everything you need for yourself and for your family.
