Advanced Love and Revival – June Letter 2024

Dear Friend,

The late great pastor Dave Roberson shared one of his last visions with the church just a few short years before he went home. In the vision, he found himself inside an incredible room that was filled with the presence of God. He described this room as a room where all things were possible. There was no such thing as the impossible, and everything just happened as a result of being there. Faith was no longer an issue of contention. The person who arrived there was no longer trying to have faith for the impossible. The miraculous just happened almost naturally. The faith and sacrifice that brought them there provided an absolute certainty for all things to be accomplished. **NOTHING WAS IMPOSSIBLE!**

Inside this room was every notable miracle that Jesus performed in the annals of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The presence of God was no doubt incomparable to anything that could be experienced outside of this room. This room was so saturated with the presence and love of God that he was compelled to name it “The Room of Agape.”

The word “Agape” is used 116 times in New Testament scripture, and it is the best word for love that describes the love that originates from God himself. Pastor Dave would, to his own dissatisfaction, try to describe the finality of this room of Agape. The maturity of the Church in coming to this place is the prerequisite for Revival.

The Revival, A World Harvest, and The Last Great Awakening were inside this place. Everything was found here, and everything culminated here. But can his vision be backed up by scripture? Is there such a thing as a baptism of the love of God? Is there really a place beyond where we are walking? Is there really such a place where all things are possible even without thought? Is there really a place where fantastic miracles are somehow inseparably tied to the love of God? What does scripture say?

Consider these words by the apostle Paul to the church of Ephesus. Keep in mind the context of this passage is solely based on the maturing of God’s love being perfected in the saints.

Ephesians 3:14 For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Ephesians 3:15 Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named,

Ephesians 3:16 That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;

Ephesians 3:17 That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love,

Ephesians 3:18 May be able to comprehend with all saints what *is* the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;

Ephesians 3:19 And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.

Ephesians 3:20 Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us,

Ephesians 3:21 Unto him *be* glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

Reading these same verses out of the Amplified Version, we get an even closer look at the specificity of the empowerment of the Love of God.

Amplified Version

14 For this reason [seeing the greatness of this plan by which you are built together in Christ], I bow my knees before the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

15 For Whom every family in heaven and on earth is named [that Father from Whom all fatherhood takes its title and derives its name].

16 May He grant you out of the rich treasury of His glory to be strengthened and reinforced with mighty power in the inner man by the [Holy] Spirit [Himself indwelling your innermost being and personality].

17 May Christ through your faith [actually] dwell (settle down, abide, make His permanent home) in your hearts! May you be rooted deep in love and founded securely on love,

18 That you may have the power and be strong to apprehend and grasp with all the saints [God's devoted people, the experience of that love] what is the breadth and length and height and depth [of it];

19 [That you may really come] to know [practically, through experience for yourselves] the love of Christ, which far surpasses mere knowledge [without experience]; that you may be filled [through all your being] unto all the fullness of God [may have the richest measure of the divine Presence, and become a body wholly filled and flooded with God Himself]!

20 Now to Him Who, by (in consequence of) the [action of His] power that is at work within us, is able to [carry out His purpose and] do superabundantly, far over and above all that we [dare] ask or think [infinitely beyond our highest prayers, desires, thoughts, hopes, or dreams]--

21 To Him *be* glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations forever and ever. Amen (so be it).

We must keep in mind that this was a petitionary prayer of Paul's for the Church. It was a request for something they did not have in fullness as of yet. Still, Paul was praying that they could come to this place.

IT WAS NOT AUTOMATIC!

This was not an automatic place just by virtue of the new birth. If it was automatic, then there would be no necessity for praying for it in a petition. This was a place of maturity, and it was also a place of **ADVANCED LOVE**.

Paul the apostle was contending for this **ADVANCED PLACE** with his entire life. He not only pursued this place, but encouraged others to do the same. Why could Paul pursue this place with such a certainty? It is because he saw it as a prize that could be achieved. He saw it as a living reality, not just something of theory.

1 Corinthians 9:24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

1 Corinthians 9:25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they *do it* to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.

1 Corinthians 9:26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:

1 Corinthians 9:27 But I keep under my body, and bring *it* into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.

Paul describes himself in the above verses as a runner and a fighter who runs and fights not with uncertainty, but in a sense of **ABSOLUTE!** He absolutely knew where his race was taking him, and he absolutely knew what his fight would achieve. And for Paul, this meant living a disciplined life of bringing his body under subjection to the will of God.

Why do we do what we do? What is our purpose? Why teach others in the Body of Christ a relentless prayer life coupled with fasting?

**IT IS BECAUSE THERE ARE SPIRITUAL PLACES OF ABSOLUTE
WAITING TO BE ACHIEVED FOR ALL OF US.**

In this place of **ADVANCED LOVE**, there is another level of anointing waiting for you personally. This will affect everything you say and do for the rest of your life. This will affect the influence that you have on other people. This will affect your ability to deliver the miraculous to people that God has in your future.

I challenge and encourage you in the love of God with all my heart to please go after this place. Go after this place with a certainty of mind that something far more can be received and accomplished in your life. Go after it with an understanding that this is not a **WHIM** (something that comes and goes), but rather an everlasting impartation of the Love and Power of God. Together, we will see this Revival. Together, we will see this Last Great Awakening in America.
